
Michele "Micky" Benedetti Men's Diving 2006-2009

An 8-time All-American and a 6-time Pac-10 champion, Micky Benedetti was named the Pac-10 Diver of the Year in back-to-back years in 2007 and 2008, finishing runner-up at NCAA Championships. In 2009, he set an ASU school record in 3-meter springboard diving with a score of 455.50, a record that still stands today.



Valerye Boyer-Wells Track and Field 1978-1981

A four-year track star for the Sun Devils, Val Boyer was a six-time All-American as a sprinter throughout her tenure. Boyer was a key member of the two national championship 4x110-yard relay teams in 1978 and 1979. In her iunior season in 1980. Bover won three individual events to claim three conference titles in the WCAA (Western Collegiate Athletic Association), emerging victorious in the 100-meter, 200-meter dash and the 4x100 meter relay.



Katelyn Boyd Softball 2009-2012

One of the best hitters in Sun Devil Softball history, Boyd finished her career second in ASU history with a .391 batting average while also placing second in slugging (.728) and on-base percentage (.505). Boyd hit 10-plus home runs in each of her four seasons at ASU. including 19 as a senior and 18 as a junior, which ranked as the second and third most in team history at the time. Boyd left ASU as the program leader with 60 doubles and 236 runs batted in, and she was second in runs (271), total bases (549), walks (167), and stolen bases (82).



Roger Detter Men's Basketball 1965-1969 Track and Field 1965-1969 Baseball 1967-1969

A three-sport athlete at ASU, Detter is one of just four players in team history to win a pair of national titles. Roger Detter was a member of two national championship teams for Sun Devil Baseball (1967, 1969).



Azahara Munoz Golf 2005-2008

Azahara Munoz left Arizona State as one of the most decorated golfers in program history. She won the 2008 NCAA Individual Title in dramatic fashion, winning in a playoff to become the ninth Sun Devil to win the National Championship. The following season, she led Arizona State to the 2009 NCAA Championship, its seventh in school history and first since 1998.



Will Sutton Football 2009-2013


Only the second two-time Pat Tillman Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year in Pac-12 Conference history, Will Sutton was a force to be reckoned with on the defensive line for the Sun Devils, Sutton saw action in 51 games, including 34 starts, and posted 161 career tackles and 20.5 career sacks, the seventh-most in team history.

Get to Know Coach Dillingham

Now in his second year, Sun Devil head coach Kenny Dillingham, at age 34, is the youngest head coach in Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). He's also the first Arizona State alum to be named head coach of the football program.

Throughout his coaching tenure, the Scottsdale native has coached four NFL draft picks, an All-American and 11 All-Conference Selections prior to joining ASU. He has been a part of six bowl games, two with the Sun Devils as an offensive assistant.

Dillingham returned to Tempe after building his resume with a track record of impressive tenures at Memphis, Auburn, Florida State and most recently as the offensive coordinator at the University of Oregon, At Oregon, he was a nominee for the 2022 Broyles Award, presented annually to the top assistant coach in college football.

Under Dillingham's guidance, Oregon quarterback Bo Nix heard his name in Heisman Trophy conversations across the season.

As an offensive assistant in 2014, Coach Dillingham was a part of a prolific offense that ranked 13th in the nation with 5.750 total yards and 34 touchdowns.

Dillingham is considered a brilliant offensive mind, and success has followed him wherever he has gone.

In 2018, he helped the Memphis Tigers rank 4th in the nation in total offense. His offense racked up 7,324 total yards, including 3,919 rushing yards.

The following year, in 2019, he helped the Tigers to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl appearance and win against football powerhouse No. 5 Alabama.





Banners/Signs

Banners and signs cannot be hung over any existing signage, block the view of another guest, or contain any advertisements or profanities. Poles of any kind or size are not allowed in Mountain America Stadium.

Cameras/Photography

Fans are welcome to bring personal cameras less than 6" and do not have a detachable lens into Mountain America Stadium. However, flash photography, monopods, tripods, and selfie sticks are not permitted in the stadium. Professional photography/cameras are not allowed in the stadium without a media credential.

Concessions

Multiple concession stands are located on all levels throughout Mountain America Stadium. All stands offer a variety of food and beverage items. Some of the specialty concessions offered for the season include Chick-fil-A, Cold Beers & Cheeseburgers, Kona Ice, Someburros, 505 Southwestern Nacho Cantina and Venezia's Pizza.

Elevators

Elevator access is limited throughout Mountain America Stadium. Individuals with specific needs for elevator access to seating areas should contact Guest Relations for more information at (480) 965-3933.

First Aid

The AMR First Aid Stations are staffed by registered nurses and physicians and are located behind the south end zone, the northwest corner of the main concourse (behind section 12), the southwest end of the upper deck (behind section 201), and on the east side. Paramedics are available during all football games and regularly patrol the stadium.

Guest Assistance Center

There are Guest Assistance Centers located inside Mountain America Stadium. They are located just inside the Southwest Gate and on the main concourse level and upper deck on the west and east sides. Guest relations representatives are available to assist with directions, seating issues, and any other questions or comments you may have.

Lost Children

Parents of lost children should contact the nearest game management staff member, including ushers and security, regarding their lost child. They may also go to the Mountain America Stadium Police Station located behind Section 12 on the concourse level for assistance or text SPARKY 69050. Please include your location (seat/section number) and issue (lost child).

Lost and Found

Mountain America Stadium provides lost and found services for its quests located at the Police Station behind Section 12 on the concourse. Found items should be taken to this location or given to a game day staff member. Lost and found items will be logged and kept for two weeks. Unclaimed items will be donated to charity after the two-week holding period. To check on or claim a lost and found item following football games, please call (480) 965-3933.

Police

The Mountain America Stadium Police Station is located on the concourse behind Section 12.

Prohibited Items

There are restrooms located throughout Mountain America Stadium. Baby changing tables are available in men's and women's restrooms throughout the stadium. There are family

restrooms located throughout the stadium on the main concourse and behind sections 5, 9, and 17.

On August 1, 2013, ASU joined more than 800 universities and colleges nationwide in becoming a tobacco-free campus. Tobacco products are not permitted in Mountain America Stadium, including e-cigarettes and smokeless cigarettes/tobacco. 


ASU's Model for the New American University



Super Bowl Sun Devils

The Sun Devils have had some great history with the Super Bowl.

Arizona State All-American Terrell Suggs was a part of the Kansas City Chiefs Super Bowl LIV in February of 2020, giving him a pair of NFL titles after previously earning a Super Bowl ring with the Baltimore Ravens back in 2013.

With Suggs helping lead Kansas City to a victory on the biggest stage in professional sports, the Chiefs became the 32nd Super Bowl-winning team to feature a Sun Devil. An incredible 34 Super Bowl rings have been earned by Sun Devils, two of them on the hand of Terrell Suggs. Suggs becomes just the sixth Sun Devil in history to win two or more Super Bowls, joining elite company: Darren Woodson (1993, 1994, & 1995 Cowboys), Mike Richardson (1986 Bears, 1990 49ers), Jim Jeffcoat (1993 & 1994 Cowboys), Grey Ruegamer (2002 Patriots, 2008 Giants), and Marvel Smith (2006 & 2009 Steelers).



History and traditions



This is Sun Devil Football

Territorial Cup.

Thanks to a historic find in a church basement several years ago, Arizona State University and the University of Arizona can now claim the oldest intercollegiate rivalry trophy in the nation. The Territorial Championship Cup, which has been registered with the NCAA, was first presented to Tempe Normal School (now ASU) on Nov. 30, 1899, following an 11-2 victory over the University of Arizona at Tucson's Carillo Gardens Field. The Territorial Cup® was lost for a time and was discovered years ago in the basement of a church that was being demolished. According to the NCAA, the previous oldest trophy was the Michigan/ Minnesota Little Brown Jug which dates back to 1909.

The Mascot

On Nov. 8, 1946, the students of Arizona State College voted 816 to 196 in favor of changing the school's nickname from the Bulldogs

The Gear

Since July 2015, Sun Devil Athletics has partnered with adidas with a goal of advancing the brand, including the use of iconic logos like the Pitchfork as well as historic logos like Sparky and the interlocking AS. The partnership with adidas set the standard for apparel contracts by creating provisions to adapt for the addition of sports and dollars allocated towards marketing and facility upgrades. The company has also shown its investment in Sun Devil student-athletes. giving them the opportunity to test and provide feedback on its latest performance gear prior to release.




2023 Sun Devil ring ceremony

The 7x National Champions took sole possession of the most USA Triathlon team national titles (seven) in a single division after winning their seventh-straight NCAA title in 2023.








Sun Devil Athletics is mourning the loss of Molly Tuter, a four-vear member of the Sun Devil women's basketball team (1994-97) who was inducted into ASU's Sports Hall of Fame in 2011. Tuter passed away on Friday (Sept. 6) at the age of 49.

At the time her Sun Devil career came to a close in 1997, Tuter was third on ASU's all-time scoring list with 1,374 career points, second in career in 3-point field goals made (116) and steals (221) and fourth in field goals made (504). Tuter, who earned All-Pac-10 Honorable Mention recognition in 1996 and 1997, was ASU's leader in rebounds all four years of her career. She also led the team in scoring and free throw percentage three times and paced the team in steals twice.

Tuter averaged a career-best 15.1 points per game both her junior and senior seasons. Tuter's senior year coincided with the first season of former Sun Devil head coach Charli Turner Thorne.

Tuter came to ASU from Soldotna High School in Soldotna, Alaska, where she was twice selected as the state's Gatorade Player of the Year.

"Our ASU women's basketball family sends our heartfelt condolences to the family, friends and loved ones of former Alaskan girls' basketball star and Sun Devil Hall of Famer Molly Tuter," says Sun Devil head coach Natasha Adair. "Molly's impact and legacy as a Sun Devil will live on within our program, university and community forever. Thank you, Molly. May you rest in peace."
